Florida continues to enhance Sex **Offender Registry**

Florida registration laws require sexual offenders and

career offenders to register their addresses with law enforcement. These addresses are available to citizens through two online registries: Florida's Sexual Offenders and Predators Registry and Florida's Career Offender Registry. Both registries offer valuable information to help Florida families stay safe.

The Florida Sexual Offenders and Predators Registry, one of the largest in the nation, allows citizens to search using the name of an offender or by using an address. You can also search facilities of higher education to determine if a registered sex offender is enrolled, volunteers, or is employed at the school. Offender email and instant message name searches are available on this reg-

New legislation, which will become law later this year, will further strengthen the registry by increasing the reporting requirements for sexual offenders who have been convicted of offenses against the elderly or disabled. The new law also requires FDLE to expand the online system for sexual predators and offenders to electronically submit their email addresses, phone numbers, and employment information among other items. This ensures timely updates to the registry when offender information changes.

The other registry, Florida's Career Offender Registry, allows citizens to quickly search a name to determine whether or not someone is a career offender. Citizens can also search by address, county, city, or zip code.

If you're not familiar with the registries, now is a good time to acquaint yourself with them. Both provide a quick and easy way to identify offenders living in your community.

Both websites mentioned in this article are below. Take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with this information and be safe.

The Tragedy of Murdered Babies

"I feel heartbroken. I feel empty. I lost my only child because I trusted somebody." Tears rolled down the young mother's face as she talked to reporters about the brutal murder of her beautiful two-year-old daughter. Donisha Barlow left her child with Jamarius Graham when she went to work April 21, never anticipating that the next time she held Aaliyah, her baby would be taking her last breaths.

According to Donisha, Graham beat her daughter so badly that she eventually died – all because the baby soiled his bed. "I don't have a child; I can't watch her grow up. I just want people to know: do not put your trust in anybody with your kids – that's family, friends, daycare, anybody. Be careful who you let your kids stay

This baby's murder is the most recent one of several in our community. For months we were flooded with details about the abuse and death of Lonzie Barton while in the care of his mother's boyfriend. Recently another little boy, a three-year-old with life-threatening injuries, was beaten on his head, stomach and legs by his mother's boyfriend (a registered sex offender) because he kept falling asleep in the bathtub. A few days after that a nine-month-old little girl in the care of her mother's boyfriend was found unresponsive in a Clay County motel and later died at the hospital.

It's unbelievable! How can such atrocities happen in a (supposedly) civilized society? I started researching the subject and found case after case of terrible child abuse and murders throughout the country. It's almost too painful to read the details of these babies' torture

While I was writing this article, a news bulletin stated that John Norfleet was convicted of first-degree murder for beating his four-year-old stepdaughter to death last year with a piece of wood. What that little girl

suffered at his hands - and others before him - is unconscionable. News4Jax reported that Jada had been previously abused in Michigan by her biological mother who pled guilty to child abuse in 2011.

The WJXT-Ch4 news team writes, "Most of the details are too graphic to report, but documents show Cheryl Norfleet confessed to her then-husband that she had sexually and physically abused Jada and her sister. Other information showed she also had not fed the chil-

"According to reports, the stories of abuse started in 2010 when Jada was just 8 months old. Police said John Norfleet confronted Cheryl Norfleet about why the baby had been losing weight and she admitted to periodically starving her and giving her food she couldn't digest. The report says that after further prodding [the girl's mother] not only admitted to sexually abusing both of the couple's daughters but also to hitting one child multiple times with a belt and the other child with a hairbrush."1

New Laws – Testing Rape Kits

The recently concluded 2016 Florida legislative session enacted an important law concerning the testing of sexual

offense evidence kits, often called rape kits. The law requires that sexual offense evidence kits be submitted to our statewide criminal analysis laboratory system for forensic testing within 30 days after the evidence is received by a law enforcement agency. This requirement exists if the report of the sexual crime is made to that agency, or when the victim or his or her representative requests that the evidence be

Our statewide criminal analysis laboratory system consists of the state-operated laboratories in Fort Myers, Jacksonville, Pensacola, Orlando, Tallahassee, Tampa, and other areas of the state, under the jurisdiction of the Department of Law Enforcement. The laboratory system also consists of the existing locally funded laboratories in Broward, Indian River, Miami/Dade, Palm Beach, and Pinellas Counties. Also included are some of the other laboratories, often private, that have assumed the function of rendering criminal analysis laboratory services to various criminal justice agencies in the

The testing of the rape kit must be completed no later than

120 days after it is submitted to a member of the statewide criminal analysis laboratory system. Collected after a sexual offense, evidence kits must be retained in a secure, environmentally safe manner until the prosecuting agency approves the kit's destruction.

The victim, or his or her representative, shall be informed of the purpose of testing and of his or her right to demand testing. The victim shall be informed by either the medical provider conducting the physical forensic examination or, if no kit is collected, a law enforcement agency that collects other DNA evidence associated with the crime.

Immediately, they decided the JC was where they wanted to volunteer their time and talents for the next year.

Following an interview with Ann Dugger, the two Rays (as we call them) were welcomed with open arms and soon put to work. Their excellent organizational skills have been instrumental in reorganizing workspace in our offices to increase productivity and appearance. They have worked at numerous Justice Coalition events, setting up resource and registration displays, welcoming event attendees and promoting JC activities. Ray, Jr., has written an article for the Victims Advocate, and both Rays hope to become more involved in the paper's monthly publication.

Ray, Sr. grew up on the Northside of Jacksonville. He graduated from JU, earned an MBA from UNF, then became a CPA and worked in the Offices of Inspector General of five different federal agencies. After earning a law degree from George Mason Law School, he started a nationwide nonprofit legal organization for the Catholic Church. He later joined the University of Virginia, holding the position of Chief Financial Officer of the UVA Children's Medical Center.

Ray, Jr. graduated from Bartram Trails High School in St. Johns County, where he worked on the school paper. He also wrote several articles for a community newspaper, reporting on local happenings among the young people of St. Johns County. He is a recent graduate of the University of Florida and intends to obtain an MBA at UNF.

During his time with the federal government, Ray, Sr. met and married his wife, Joan. Before she became ill with breast cancer, she held several executive positions in the federal government, including chief procurement officer of the US Mint and associate director for procurement policy of the US Treasury. When she was diagnosed with Stage IV breast cancer, Joan and the two Rays moved to Jacksonville. While she was fighting the disease, the family continued to enjoy life, travelling to many countries and spending much of their free time just relaxing on Jacksonville's beautiful

As she had done her entire life, Joan continued to volunteer at local non-profit organizations. Until she could no longer ably walk, she performed daily volunteer work at the Betty Griffin Thrift Shoppe, which helps abused women in St. Johns County. Upon her death in 2013 and Ray, Jr.'s graduation from UF last August, the two Rays spent six months travelling, driving across America, visiting Europe and going on cruises


to Alaska and the Caribbean.



At one point, the subject stopped running and pointed a firearm at his own head and advised that he was going to take his own life or make a Police Officer do it. When Sergeant C.J. Dyal arrived on scene, he met with James and Michael who told him the subject's location and the fact that he was still armed. Sergeant Dyal took a cover position and advised Michael to begin a dialogue with the subject

while James remained in a tactical position in an effort to keep the subject from escaping

Throughout the next hour, while the JSO S.W.A.T. team was en route, James and Michael never wavered from their assigned tasks. Eventually S.W.A.T. took control of the scene and the subject surrendered without harming anyone, including himself

Sergeant Dyal said, "I find it extremely commendable that Officers Griffin and Casteel freely give their personal time to assist the men and women of JSO and unselfishly serve the citizens of Jacksonville. Not only did they volunteer to respond to a violent incident, they never once hesitated to put themselves in harm's way..."

JoAnne Seach



Purple Heart Medal

Randy White

Sergeant Randy White, a supervisor in the Narcotics Unit, was leading his team last July as members of the unit were conducting a city-wide operation. During the early evening hours undercover detectives completed a narcotics purchase at a location on the Southside. Following the transaction they gave the take-

down signal for the arrest teams to move in and take the suspects into custody. As the take-down teams moved in, one of the suspects accelerated his vehicle forward and struck Randy, causing him to go over the roof of the car and land headfirst on the ground behind the suspects' vehicle.

Multiple detectives believed he might have been killed, but following the impact Randy attempted to get up off the ground even though he was disoriented and bleeding profusely from the back of his head. JSO Reserve Officer Bill Coyle, who was assisting with the operation, immediately went to render first aid. Meanwhile, Randy was still trying to coordinate the pursuit of the suspect who was fleeing the scene and he even managed to make notification to his chain of command. He actually had to be held down to keep him from standing up and causing further injury to himself.

Ultimately, he was transported to a local hospital where he was treated for his injuries. He worked tirelessly during physical therapy sessions and was able to return to full duty within a few months after the incident.

Randy's Lieutenant said, "The incident never diminished Sergeant White's desire to lead his detectives in their daily objectives. Since returning to work, [he] has displayed the same motivation and passion that he's always expressed towards the narcotics unit and the citizens of this community."

Undersheriff Pat Ivey said, "Randy, thank you for your unwavering dedication to your job and to this agency. We are very thankful you have recovered from your injuries and are back working with your team to help keep our city safe. I am honored to be able to present you with this Purple Heart medal."

Bondi, FDLE warn about dangerous 'super pill'

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Attorney General Pam Bondi and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement are warning about a new "super pill" that contains deadly amounts of fentanyl mixed with other drugs. The FDLE said counterfeit drugs have been found in which fentanyl is mixed with prescription drugs such as Oxycodone and Xanax. When sold illegally on the street, the drugs look like the legal prescriptions, but dangerous amounts of fentanyl can quickly lead to death for users.

Central Florida and the Tampa Bay area are the main locations where the new drugs have been found. But Bondi said the issue needs to be discussed across the state. "Please, please, please just talk to your kids about it," she said. "Just don't take anything if you don't know what it is, because when they are cutting it with fentanyl some of these kids are dying within seconds. I say kids, but some of them are 20s and older."

When prescribed legally, fentanyl is a pain medication, stronger than morphine, and is given to people dealing with severe, chronic pain. At least 10 deaths in Florida have been linked to the use of fentanyl-cut drugs.

For years, law enforcement has struggled to keep pace with the ever-changing chemistry of synthetic drugs. Every time a substance was outlawed, the bad guys would tweak the chemistry and start peddling a newer drug until it, too, was added to the state's list of illegal substances. And when that happened, yet another drug would be created.

Not only would the constant changes frustrate law enforcement, but also the newly cre-


ated substances posed untold dangers to users, landing increasing numbers of young people in hospitals and morgues. But now, authorities say, a new law that goes into effect July 1 should stop the cat-and-mouse game by changing the way illegal drugs are defined in Florida. Under the new law, no longer will prosecutors be hamstrung waiting for researchers to determine the pharmacological effects of each new substance before the attorney general can issue an emergency order and lawmakers can add the specific chemical formula-

The new law defines illegal drugs by their molecular structures, making it easier to prove that a substance is "substantially similar" to an illegal drug already listed as illegal. And small deviations in those structures are not enough to make substances legal. Under the current law, prosecutors have to prove that slightly changed substances have the same physiological effect as the predecessor illegal drug.

The change in the law comes at a trouble-some time for medical professionals, who are seeing a surge in overdoses from synthetic substances, said Alfred Aleguas, director of the Florida Poison Information Center for the Tampa region at Tampa General Hospital. "I think there's a lot of people using these thinking they're fairly benign, and you just don't know what you're getting. There's no control over what sort of dose anybody's getting."

In the first three months of the year, 56 cases involving overdoses from synthetic cannabinoids were reported from Florida to poison control centers. Last year, there were 269 calls from Florida and 7,794, nationwide, a surge from the previous year's numbers of 176 and 3,682.

All you have to do is Google "child abuse" and "live-in boyfriends" on the Internet to find horrendous accounts of little kids – some just babies - being beaten, sexually abused and killed by babysitters, boyfriends and even parents. At the end of this article I mention a few (of many) such stories that occurred within the past year. How has our society

Today's concept of morality (or lack thereof) offers no constraint for sexual behavior, and the result is young people having sex with no thought that the act might produce offspring for whom they are totally unprepared. Some are kids themselves; how can they properly care for a little one? The secret word is earthquake. Others have babies they didn't plan for, so maybe the child gets passed around among family members willing to asresponsibility him/her, or maybe is left with an unreliable babysitter or – as we're writing about here – with a boyfriend who has no emotional ties to the little one in his care, let alone childcare inclinations or skills.

But what about the babies born into these circumstances? Perhaps the parents' lifestyles include dealing drugs - a lucrative income for many that doesn't require education or work skills. Or maybe the mother does want to care for her child but has to work and she trusts a boyfriend to babysit the little one. There are many variables that play a role in these lives that too often end in tragedy.

Obviously, these scenarios don't apply to everyone; most babies are welcomed with love, are nurtured, cherished and raised in a safe, secure environment. It's those who "fall through the cracks" and end up dead, maybe disposed of in a garbage dump, about whom we feel such anguish.

In a Sept. 25, 2015, article by Samantha Allen, Why Are Mothers' Boyfriends So Likely to Kill?, she quotes the following findings from two studies on the subject:

"A 2001 study in Child Maltreatment found that 'the presence of a non-biological father figure in the home should be considered a significant predictor of a future child maltreatment report.' In a sample of 644 mother-child pairs, the authors found no significant difference in maltreatment between mother-father house holds and single-mother households, but did find that children with a cohabiting 'father surrogate' were 'twice as likely to be reported for maltreatment after his entry into the home.'

"In 2002, a study in Pediatrics looked specifically at cases of fatal child maltreatment over a two-year time period in Missouri and found the risk of fatal maltreatment was not increased for children living with a single parent, but that it was raised eight times if

Who's Really Watching Your Child? More than 25 percent of child protective investigations last year involved a non-relative caregiver as the alleged perpetrator. The "Who's Really Watching Your Child?" campaign brings together child care providers, child welfare professionals, medical physicians and state agencies to help provide safe environments for Florida's children ages 0 - 4. We encourage parents to know the backgrounds and parenting skills of anyone who is watching their child.

they were living with unrelated adults, 'primarily in households including biologically unrelated adult males and boyfriends of the child's mother.'

"Again, these cases are not necessarily determined exclusively by the boyfriend's gender. After all, according to 2013 statistics from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (PDF), moth-

ers acting alone were responsible for 40 percent of child abuse, compared to 20 percent for fathers. Mothers were also responsible for over twice the percentage of child fatalities as fathers. Bear in mind that women are more likely to be a child's primary caretaker.

"What the research strongly suggests, however, is that the risk of child maltreatment is increased by complex

family dynamics. Less than half of U.S. children, according to Pew, live in two-parent, firstmarriage households."2

There is insufficient space to list the 26 murders I pulled from accounts nationwide about murdered babies or young children. Here are just a few:

Baldwinsville, N.Y. February 2016

A 3-month-old infant in critical condition suffered a severe hemorrhage to his brain, inflicted by his father.

Philadelphia, N.Y. February 2016

A 6-week-old baby died after being taken to the hospital for cardiac arrest and a severe brain injury. The mother's 23year-old boyfriend, who was responsible for watching the baby while she was a work, was charged with second-degree murder.


Indianapolis, Ind. February 2016

The 31-year-old boyfriend of a babysitter responsible for a two-year-old is charged with the child's death from blunt force trauma to her head.

Greenville County, S.C. January 2016

A toddler, who suffered a head injury and died a week after she was hospitalized with a 'non-accidental' head injury, was in the care of her mother's live-in boyfriend.

We can bring these troubling statistics down by encouraging citizens to make healthier choices and by strengthening policies to support creating healthier surroundings for Jacksonville families.

On April 7, I launched *Journey to One*, a citywide health initiative focused on building and strengthening partnerships, resources and programs that promote nutrition, exercise, walkability, weight loss, disease prevention and safer commu-

In addition, the new law requires that by January 1, 2017, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and each lab within the statewide criminal analysis laboratory system, in coordination with the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence, must adopt and disseminate guidelines and procedures for the collection, submission, and testing of DNA evidence obtained in connection with an alleged sexual crime.

The guidelines and procedures must include standards for packaging, what evidence must be submitted

for testing, time frames for evidence submission, and time frames for evidence analysis.

The new law also directs that if a sexual offense evidence kit is not collected, the lab may receive an exam and other items directly related to the crime scene, such as clothing or bedding or personal items left behind by the sus-

This law was approved by the governor on March 23, 2016, and takes effect July 1, 2016. The new statute is identified as Section 943.36 of the Florida Statutes.



A sexual predator designation requires that a person be convicted of a firstdegree felony sex crime, or two second-degree felony sex crimes (with offenses, convictions or release from court sanctions occurring within 10 years) and which occurred after October 1, 1993.
